

Pastor's Corner **April 2026**

Why Easter Matters

Easter is one of the most significant holidays in the world. It commemorates the resurrection of Jesus Christ, an event that carries deep spiritual, historical, and cultural meaning. Easter has come to symbolize hope, renewal, and the possibility of new beginnings.

For you and me, Easter represents the foundational cornerstone of our belief system. The resurrection of Jesus is seen as proof of victory over sin and death, affirming the promise of eternal life. Without Easter, the story of Christianity would be incomplete—this moment transforms a narrative of suffering into one of triumph and redemption. It is why Easter is often considered more central than even Christmas in theological terms.

Easter resonates because of its universal themes, even outside of the Church. The idea that life can emerge from loss, that light can overcome darkness, and that new beginnings are always possible speaks to every human being. These themes make Easter meaningful for people going through personal challenges, transitions, growth, or the unknown.

Since Easter arrives in the spring, it aligns naturally with the rebirth of nature—flowers bloom, days grow longer, the sun seems brighter and warmth returns. This seasonal change reinforces Easter's symbolism of renewal. Traditions like decorating eggs or Easter dinners reflect this time and sense of fresh starts and joy that can be shared.

Why does Easter still matter today? In a fast-paced and uncertain world, Easter offers a pause—a moment to reflect on resilience, faith, and the possibility of transformation. When viewed through a religious lens, its message remains powerful: endings are not always final, and renewal is always within reach, and we can believe that resurrection can be ours through faith in Jesus!

Easter matters not just because of what it commemorates, but because of what it inspires—hope, connection, and the courage to begin again. Jesus is alive! He was resurrected so that you and I could also have that magnificent hope - life eternal!

Luke 24:6-7 *"He is not here, but is risen! Remember how He told you... that the Son of Man must be delivered... and be crucified, and the third day rise again."*

"He is risen...He is risen indeed!"

Children's Easter Celebration





Adult/Child Protection Training


